# OMA Services and Teams Roles

- ❑ **MPS:** Specify the **force or operational requirements** for individual military personnel, military formed units and unit equipment in new or revised concepts of operation and contingency plans.
- ❑ **FGS:** Generate **appropriate military capabilities** (including generation, rotation of all military contingents and individuals)
- ❑ **CMOS:** Monitor **current operations** and contribute to Crisis Response
- ❑ **AT:** Deliver strategic military and threat assessments in current and potential peacekeeping operations (**Anticipate and respond to CIRs**)
- ❑ **PDT:** Develop **Guidance, Policy and Doctrine**; OMA Partnership Liaison
- ❑ **MPET:** Oversee and analyse the **performance of UN missions' military components** and provide recommendations to DPO, DPPA, DOS and TCCs

Contribute to the development of UN system-wide frameworks and doctrines related to peacekeeping;



Develop standards, policies and training material to strengthen performance of the military components deployed in peace operations;



Serve as focal point for liaison and partnerships with military elements of international and regional organizations as well as for civil-military coordination with humanitarian organizations and United Nations system partners;  
Serve as focal point for gender streamlining across OMA.



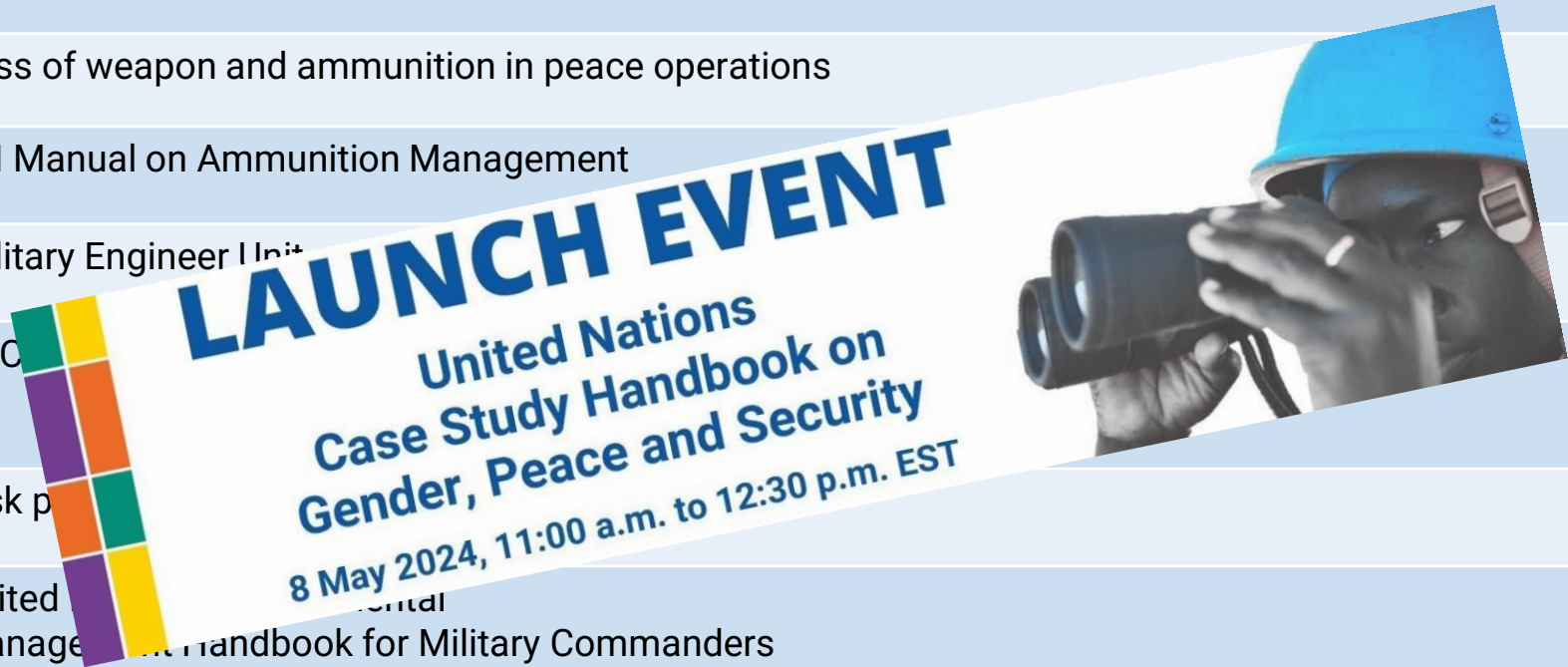

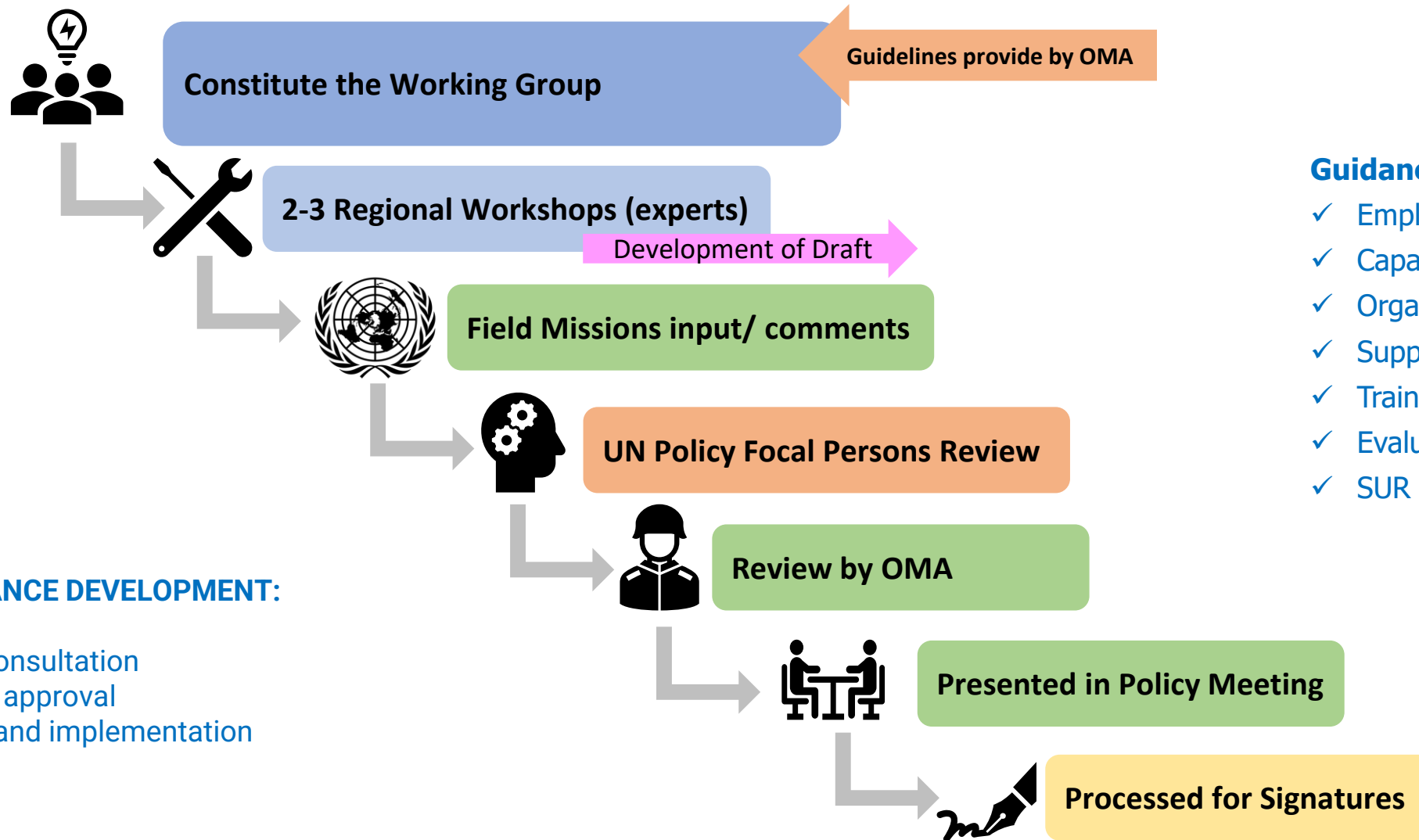

# Updates of PK training (2023-2024)

## New development: RTP on Force protection for military and police units

- **1<sup>st</sup> TOT: 8 – 19 April 2024, CoESPU, Italy: completed**
- **2<sup>nd</sup> TOT: 22 Jul – 2 Aug, Republic of Korea: planning is ongoing**
- **3<sup>rd</sup> TOT: 7 – 18 Oct 2024, Hungary: planning is ongoing**

## New development: RTP on addressing MDMH military and police units

- Pilot course for validation is done 26 Feb – 8 Mar 2024, Brindisi. Proofreading ongoing; once approved, advertised to Member States.

## Revisions of the STMs and RTPs:

- **CPTM:** Pilot course for validation, 20 – 31 May, Brindisi: Validation is ongoing
- **UNSO STM:** Synchronizing with CPTM review, estimated to be ready for TOTs Nov 2024
- **UNMO STM:** 1-year project to review, starts 1 Jul 2024 and ends 30 Jun 2025.
- **UNIBAT STM:** ongoing efforts

## Training recognitions (FY 2023-2024)

- **MNG:** PDT-M certified by Sep 2023
- **AUS:** MPKI and CPOC-M to be certified by June 2024
- **BGD:** CPOC-M to be certified by June 2024

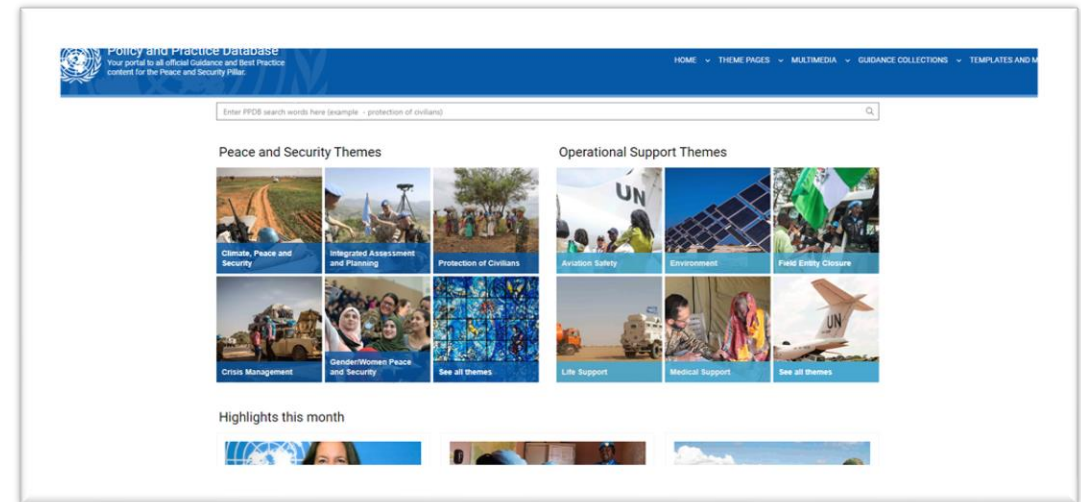
## CPTM

- ITS is reviewing the CPTM. The CPTM Validation Course is currently being organized in Brindisi (21-31 May), with 12 T/PCC trainers. The 2024 version of the CPTM is expected to be released as a final package by September this year, which will be followed by training of trainers (TOTs).
