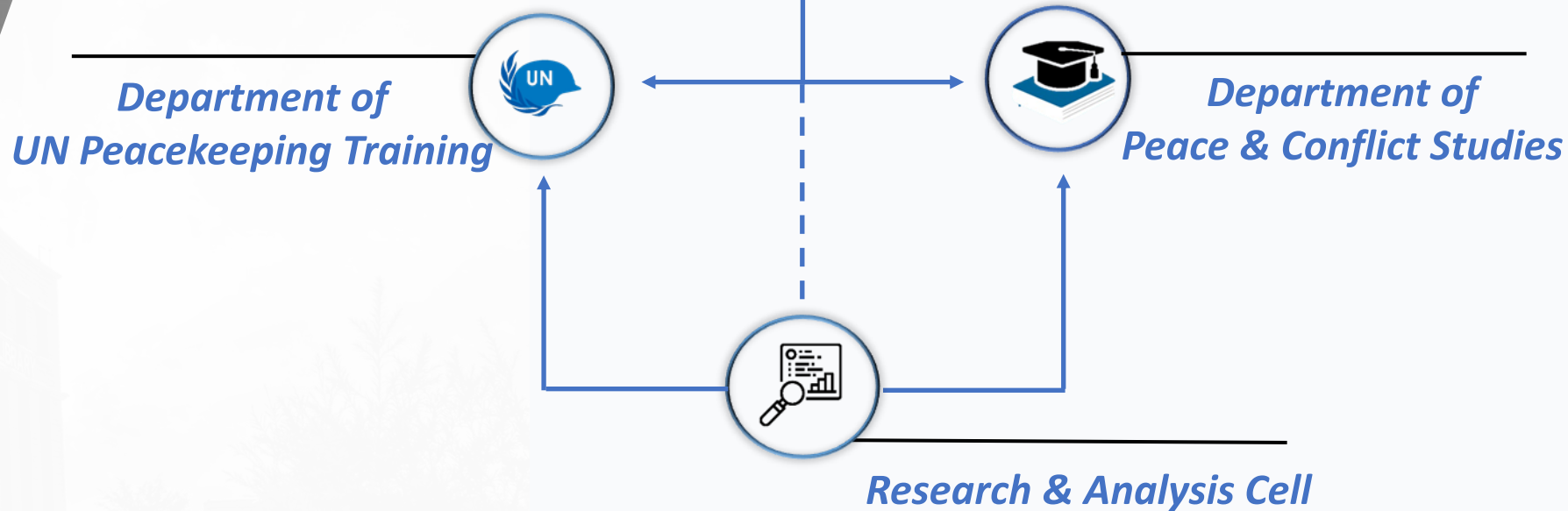

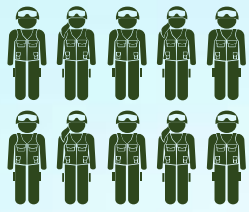


**PICTORAL OVERVIEW OF

Congo - 1960**



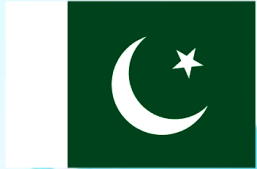

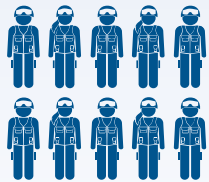
