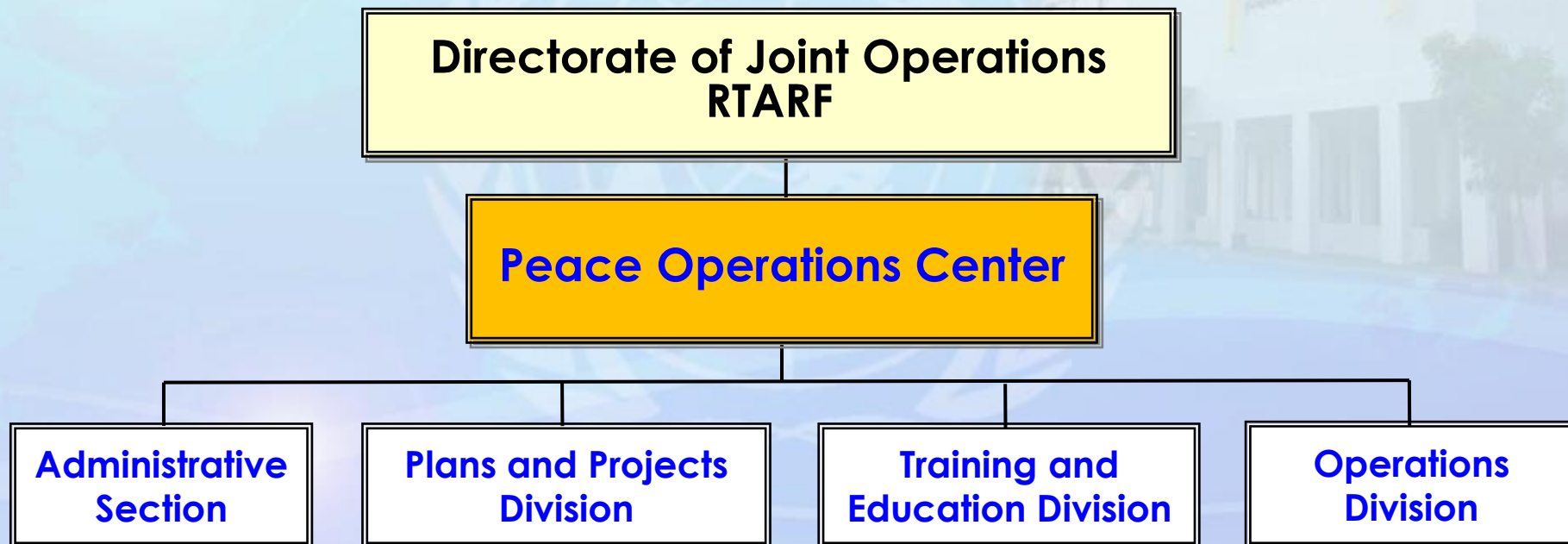

Tasks and Responsibilities :

- As a staff element to provide recommendations for CDF's decision making
- As an operation element to manage deployment of PKF
- As a National Training Center/Center of Excellence to develop and organize PDT
- As a representative of national command element to exercise national command over deployed contingent(s) and sustain their operations logistically

Note: POC is the sole element in managing RTARF's PK deployment throughout the cycle of raise, equip, train, sustain, deploy, command and support.

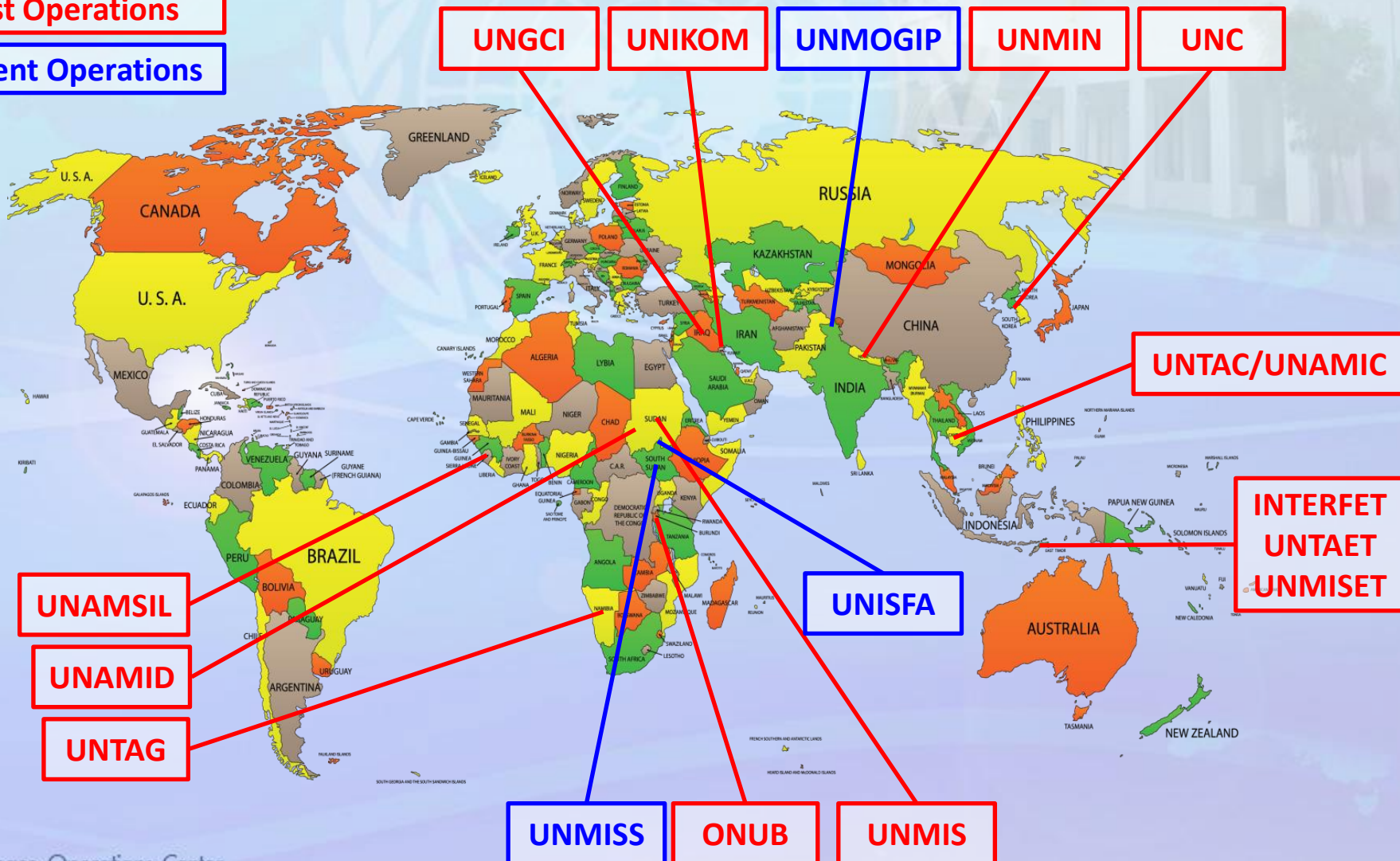

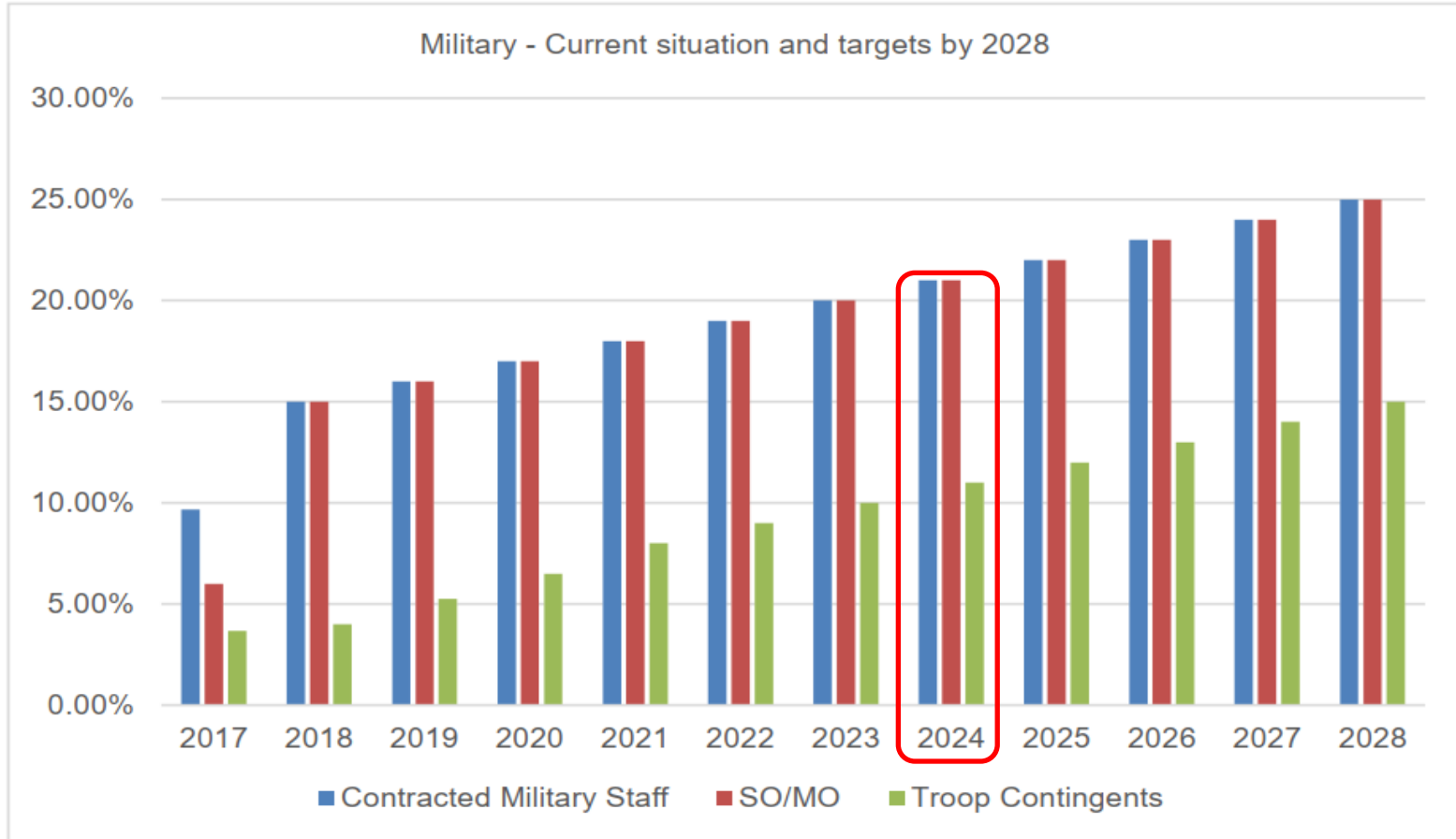

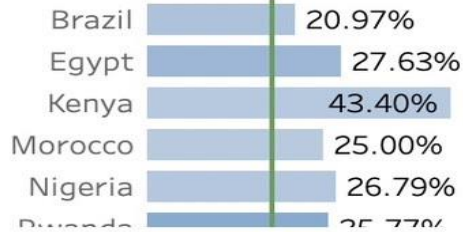

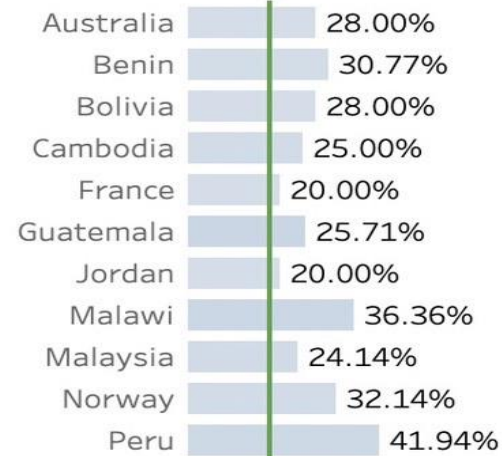
TCCs contributing >100 personnel



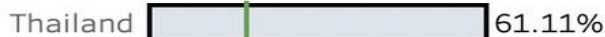
TCCs contributing 50-99 personnel



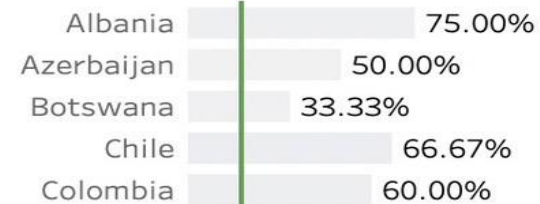
TCCs contributing 25-49 personnel

Plans for Increasing the number of female officers in the Peacekeeping of the Royal Thai Armed



➤ **Short range plan**

- Increase the rate of female soldiers in those areas

where the RTARF can request a transfer of the rate.

➤ **Intermediate range plan**

- Find a solution or channels for waiving Ministry of Defense regulations and various regulations that limit the role of female soldiers in combat-related operations. It will make it possible to recruit female

soldiers in the position of the

➤ **Long range plan**

- Send ready units that can be deploy more women, such as Level 2 field hospitals (PCRS at Level 3), where the number of women can be averaged with the existing units.

- Coordinate with the Royal Thai Army in preparing units in the PCRS system.

- ❖ **Actions when a convoy is ambushed**
- ❖ **First aid in the field**



Way Forward

- Gradually increasing female military participations;
 - IUP to exceed 15%,
 - contingent unit at reasonable growth
- Female Engagement Unit to be embedded in deployed contingent
